<u>NEW PARENTS:</u> Please come into the Band Office to register your child, this process is not automatically done. (*Registration takes approximately seven (7) months.*)

Bring in original long form birth certificate; the long form birth certificate that lists both parents on it.

Fill in a form for registry:

<u>PLEASE</u>: I cannot do a card unless you have identification. If you have <u>LOST</u> your identification; you will need to go to Services BC (the government office in Charlotte) and order a birth certificate. Services BC phone number is 559-4452. (if you do not have a valid passport; you still need <u>two pieces</u> of identification; one must be a VALID picture ID) Ask Service BC about the health card picture ID. These rules are outlined by Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC)(NOT by me or Skidegate Band Council.)

VANCOUVER OFFICE; the Vancouver office will no long issue paper laminate (CIS) cards. They will be starting the process for the new SCIS (Secure Certificate Indian Status) as of February 4, 2013. All accepted applications are sent to the National Processing Unit and the SCIS cards are sent to the applicants directly once produced. There is a waiting period, during which the individual's CIS card can be used if it is still valid.

to marriage; you will need to send an original marriage certificate. These are processed in Quebec; so it will take from eight weeks to 16 weeks to process.

You will also need a <u>copy</u> of two pieces of identification or a copy of your valid passport.

You can download the new SCIS (Secure Certificate of Indian Status) applications on line; go to AANDC/SCIS.

The following statement has been posted on the AANDC website: "Border Crossing:

AANDC is currently only issuing the in-Canada Secure Certificate of Indian Status. Until further notice, all applications for the border-crossing Secure Certificate of Indian Status will be converted to the in-Canada Secure Certificate of Indian Status. Individuals receiving a Secure Certificate of Indian Status will receive a letter providing this information.

For crossing the border into the United States (U.S.) via land ports of entry (which can include ferry and lake crossings), AANDC has been advised that, in the near term, U.S. border officials will accept both the SCIS and older Certificates of Indian Status as valid identity documents.

The Government of Canada cautions individuals that the duration for the acceptance of these documents for border crossing purposes into the United States is entirely at the discretion of the U.S. Government. A list of documents approved for entering the United States can be found at Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative. Please note that travellers entering the United States by air continue to be required to present a valid passport or, in certain circumstances, a NEXUS card.

- -Open burning is not advised, unless tended with a water hose during burning -never leave a fire unattended
- -this is a perfect time to clean wood-burning appliance chimneys
- -check the condition of Fire extinguishers and Smoke alarms
- -no burning of trash-piles
- -be ready to evacuate in case of Interface/Forest fires-prepare a (72 hour) R.E.P. {rapid escape pack}
- -keep brush cut around houses
- -ensure your water-hose can reach to all of your houses exposures
- -have been called out three times to extinguish unattended Waste pile fires already
